Screening of the film "Nana" and discussion with Lithuania's teachers and students

On April 1, The Secretariat of the International Commission, in cooperation with the Embassy of the United States of America in Vilnius, hosted a screening of the film "Nana" and a discussion with Lithuania's teachers and students who are in Education Centers. "Nana" Tolerance is а documentary about Holocaust survivor Maryla Michalowski-Dyamant. The event was opened by the Ambassador of the United States of America to Lithuania, Robert S. Gilchrist, and the representative of the US Embassy on the Holocaust issues, Ms. Cherrie Daniels. After the film screening, there was an interactive meeting with the film's director Serena Dykman. The event was attended by more than 100 students, teachers, and educators.

Yom HaShoah - Commemoration of Heroic Resistance to Nazism and Remembrance of the Holocaust Victims

This year, Yom HaShoah fell in Israel on April 8; it marks the uprising of the Warsaw Ghetto when a group of people then imprisoned in the ghetto heroically stood against the Nazis. This year, in commemoration of Yom HaShoah, a partner of the International Commission's Secretariat, the European March of the Living Organization (EMOTL), invited young people, teachers, and other organizations' representatives from various countries to take part in a virtual initiative to remember that it is possible to resist the aggression, the evil powers just like the Warsaw Ghetto prisoners did. The initiative was named: never means never (https://nevermeansnever.com/). Many teachers and students from Tolerance Education Centers in Lithuania took part in this virtual initiative.



Screening of an educational film on the subject of Jewish history in Warsaw

On April 28, the Embassy of the Republic of Poland in Vilnius, in cooperation with the Secretariat of the International Commission, invited the teachers of the Tolerance Education Centers to the screening and discussion of an educational film "Muranow - Northern Quarter." The film was created at the initiative of the POLIN Museum in Warsaw and is intended for pupils, students, and teachers. The film aims to introduce the life of the Jewish community in Warsaw before WW II, the imprisonment of people in the ghetto, the history of the ghetto uprising, and the fate of those who survived the Holocaust after the war. A large group of teachers and educators from all over Lithuania attended the event.

Thirty-one project on the history of Jews will be implemented in Lithuania's schools in 2021

Thirty-one projects on the history of local Jews and their destiny during the Holocaust will be implemented in Lithuanian public education schools in 2021. In the autumn of 2020, a two-month international workshop, "Training on the Holocaust and Human Rights Violations," was organized by the Olga Lengyel Institute from the United States of America (abbreviated as TOLI), together with the Secretariat of the International Commission and the Lithuanian Jewish Community. The workshop was attended by 40 teachers and educators from all over Lithuania. The event was held online. After the workshop, teachers were able to apply to TOLI for some funds to support projects about their local Jewish community, its fate during the Holocaust, and the perpetuation of historical memory. Thirty-one projects have received support and will be implemented in 21 schools during 2021.
