Lithuanian educators heard a symphony dedicated to Chiune Sugihara

On 4 November, the Kaunas State Philharmonic hosted a dress rehearsal of the world premiere of "Atnešantys šviesą" *("Bringing light")*, attended by more than 400 educators and students.

The Yad Vashem Institution – the World Centre for Holocaust Research and Commemoration – invited the Secretariat of the International Commission to invite Lithuanian teachers and students from Tolerance Education Centers to a dress rehearsal of the symphony "Atnešantys šviesą" ("Bringing light"), dedicated to the memory of Chiune Sugihara. More than 400 people (teachers, students, museum staff, librarians, and representatives of various institutions) attended the event at the Kaunas State Philharmonic. The guests were able to see the exhibition "Pasaulio tautų teisuoliai" ("Righteous Among the Nations") organized by the Yad Vashem Institution.









Lecture by historian Algirdas Jakubčionis in Skaudvilė on Russian history and its hostile politics

Teachers' meeting with a new Director of Yad Vashem and the Israeli Ambassador to Lithuania

On 8 November, teachers and educators met with the new Director of Yad Vashem, Dani Dayan, and the Ambassador of the State of Israel to Lithuania, Hadas Wittenberg Silverstein, at the Vilna Gaon Jewish Museum.

The meeting with Lithuanian educators who participated in internships at Yad Vashem, the International School for Holocaust Studies, was an initiative of the Embassy of Israel in Lithuania and the Yad Vashem institution. The meeting aimed to exchange views on the benefits and the meaning of internships. 362 Lithuanian teachers have already participated since 2003.

The meeting was attended by representatives of the Embassy of Israel and the Yad Vashem Institution, the Chairman of the International Commission Emanuelis Zingeris and the staff of the Secretariat of the International Commission, the Vice-Minister of Education, Science and Sport Ramūnas Skaudžius, representatives of the Vilna Gaon Museum of Jewish History, and 22 teachers and education staff from various Lithuanian educational institutions.

Events of the Tolerance Education Centers:

The history of the local Jewish community and rescuers of Jews in Pakruojis

At the end of September, an event was held at the Pakruojis Synagogue to commemorate the fate of the local Jewish community during the Second World War and to remember the local luminaries – the rescuers of Jews. The book "Holokaustas Lietuvos provincijoje 1941 metais" ("The Holocaust in the Province of Lithuania in 1941") by historian Arūnas Bubnys, published by the International Commission in 2021, was presented to the audience in remembrance of the Holocaust that took place in Pakruojis region. The exhibition of the Vilna Gaon Museum of Jewish History, "Išsigelbėjęs žydų vaikas pasakoja apie ŠOA" ("A Rescued Jewish Child Talks About the Shoah"), was displayed to raise awareness on the topic of Jewish rescuers.
