#### SEMINAR FOR TEACHERS IN COOPERATION WITH CENTROPA

From 19 to 21 February, a seminar for teachers was held in Kaunas, organised by Centropa in cooperation with the Secretariat of the International Commission. The three-day seminar, "Methods of teaching the history of Lithuanian Jews and the Holocaust using Centropa materials," was aimed at teachers and educators who have already participated in Centropa events.

Twenty-six teachers and educational staff from all over Lithuania took part in the event. The seminar was organised on Centropa's (Austria) initiative in cooperation with the Secretariat of the International Commission and with the support of the Claims Conference and the European Commission. <u>More</u>

# COMMEMORATION OF THE DAY OF THE RESCUERS OF LITHUANIAN JEWS

For the second year in a row, Lithuania commemorated the Day of Rescuers of Lithuanian Jews on 15 March. The commemorations in Vilnius began early in the morning. More than 120 Vilnius schoolchildren and their teachers visited the Jewish Culture and Information Centre, where they learned about the stories of the Jewish rescuers, and Yad Vashem, the International Holocaust Remembrance Centre in Israel. They had the opportunity to immortalise the names of the Lithuanian Jewish rescuers in a specially created symbolic place of the Righteous Among the Nations.

On that day, representatives of 3 Lithuanian regional schools came to Vilnius on the initiative of the Government of the Republic of Lithuania and the Secretariat of the International Commission. The students and their teachers not only visited the new Museum of Litvak Identity and the exhibition on the Jewish Rescuers at Vilnius City Hall but also took part in the official event commemorating the Day of the Rescuers of Lithuanian Jews, held at Vilnius University. Students from Alytus, Marijampolė, and Utena read the names of the Jewish rescuers together with politicians, diplomats, members of the Lithuanian Jewish community, students, and public figures.

The Day of the Rescuers of Lithuanian Jews events were also held in other cities and towns at Tolerance Education Centres. <u>More</u>

## VARĖNA HOSTS TRADITIONAL SONG FESTIVAL "SONGS FROM THE EXILE"

On 19 April, the traditional song festival "Songs from the Exile" was held at the Varena Cultural Centre. It is a traditional spring event held to commemorate the songs sung in exile and in the gulags.

Songs from the Exile" was an engaging event where representatives of 16 schools showed their performances. The performances were not only traditional renditions, but also contemporary interpretations with new arrangements. The diversity of the event was further enhanced by the inclusion of a song by Ukrainian resistance fighters, performed in Ukrainian by students from Troškūnai Gymnasium.

The festival "Songs from Exile" was organised by the Secretariat of the International Commission in cooperation with the Tolerance Education Centre of the Ažuolo Gymnasium in Varėna. 2024 was the tenth edition of the Song Festival. The first one took place in Vilnius in 2014, and since 2015 it has been held annually in Varėna. <u>More</u>
